- Worldwide,, 3 million deaths every year result from harmful use of alcohol, this represents 5.3% of all deaths.
- The harmful use of alcohol is a causal factor in more than 200 disease and injury conditions.
- Overall 5.1% of the global burden of disease and injury is attributable to alcohol, as measured in disability-adjusted life years.
- Alcohol consumption causes death and disability relatively early in life. In the age group 20-39 years approximately 13.5% of the all deaths are alcohol attributable.

Elma, born in 1920, was brought up in a Christian home and environment. She was made aware that alcohol was a 'no-no' and stories emphasised this at home and school. When she was eight years old, a lecturing WCTU missionary visited her home and impressed her greatly. In 1943 she became a member of WCTU when invited to a meeting. She remained a member, faithfully wearing her white ribbon brooch until she died on October 28, 2022. Elma worked with and supported WCTU in Sydney, Wagga Wagga, Adelaide, Perth and Cooranbong, NSW. In her retirement Elma was president of a Union in NSW for 10 years. She lectured, spoke, provided literature, distributed literature and books, promoted children's temperance events, attended the court to object to bottle shops being opened at Cooranbong. She mentored many younger women. Elma attended national conventions and the World Convention in Adelaide in 2013. She was a ball of energy and enthusiasm for God, Home and Humanity. She is already sadly missed. Her love for and attention to people was inspiring right to her last days and her influence will live on. Glenda Amos, our capable and long standing member and treasurer of WCTU Australia Ltd, is her daughter. Grand-daughters also belong. WCTU conveys our deepest sympathies to Glenda and her family.

The Story of Kerryn Redpath

Kerryn Redpath grew up in a loving family and attended good schools. She was blessed at birth with a strong, healthy body, had many good friends and was involved in several sporting activities. Despite this ideal upbringing, as is so common for teens who just want to fit in, she began to follow her peers into the party scene, naively entering the drug culture of her time. Blinded by the reality surrounding her, Kerryn soon progressed from legal substances to marijuana, which in turn, led her down the slippery slope into poly-drug use. Over the following years, while working full-time in a well-respected inner-city office, Kerryn's life began to spiral out of control until her near demise at age 25, when she was struck down with drug-related heart and kidney failure.

Kerryn spent almost five months, gravely ill, in The Alfred Hospital, Melbourne, where she came close to death on several occasions, at one point requiring acute cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). She has not touched an illicit drug since that time and unfortunately, has been left with physical scars requiring medication that has greatly affected her life. **Kerryn deeply regrets the choices of her youth** and is passionate about using her knowledge and lessons learned, for the benefit of others.

In 2010 a teacher, who knew of her story, contacted Kerryn and asked her to speak to the Year 10 students in the school where he taught. Her message was so well received that this became the catalyst for her current Drug & Alcohol Awareness presentations that have taken her to schools and businesses across Australia. Her own shocking personal experiences have led Kerryn to explore and understand the vulnerability of young people and how to best prepare them for encounters of all kinds. She has also become well versed on the risks and side effects associated with drug and alcohol use and abuse.

Kerryn has suffered and witnessed so much of the dark side of substance use, that her presentations in no way glamourise drug use, as clearly indicated in employee, staff and student feedback. On the contrary, her presentations openly relay how easily young people from any demographic can slip into this lifestyle and the dangers that can pose.

Kerryn's presentations carefully blend a combination of up to date information with real-life stories, covering some of the various factors that lead people to substance use, direct students, who may have suffered trauma, to help services rather than self-medicating and conclude with a message of hope. The responses received from all audiences are consistently positive.

Her message is not purely academic. As a result of her experience, Kerryn is regularly contacted by parents or loved ones of people of varying ages who are battling addiction and she has had the privilege of guiding some into rehab with some great outcomes. But this is a tough battle!

Kerryn is the author of two published books, firstly, 'Out of the Darkness', which includes the horror stories that turn to hope as she finds a faith in God. And secondly, 'Chasing After the Wind', the more secular version that covers the same horror stories and the incredible turn-around of her life, plus an educational side and much more.
